

What to Expect From an IDLA Teacher

- The instructor adheres to the Code of Ethics for Idaho Professional Educators
- Timely documentation, including end of unit progress (grade) reports and final grades
- The instructor will advertise and be available for office hour(s) at regular intervals throughout the week
- The instructor will ensure instructional modifications required by a special education student's Individual Education Plan (IEP) or 504, are being met.
- The instructor will document all relevant communication entries--including important phone calls, emails, chats, and IM's to students, parents and site coordinators
- A culture of academic writing will be modeled and encouraged. Regular class assignments will be graded within 72 hours (3 days); longer course assignments, projects, course papers, graded within 96 hours (4 days)
- At least one assignment in each unit receives specific and detailed feedback.
- The instructor will participate in all asynchronous communication activities (discussion boards, wikis, blogs, and voice boards)
- The instructor will make a welcome call home within the first 2 weeks of class.
- The instructor will communicate with an adult if a student's grade falls below 70% on on even numbered progress reports
- In high school and middle school level courses, the instructor will accept all late assignments for at least 50% of value and allow assignments to be redone. This includes alternatives to discussion boards in cases where the student has not participated in a timely manner (see course syllabus for your instructor's specific policy).
 - <u>DUAL CREDIT course note</u>: Late work and assignment redo policies are subject to college or university policies which may not allow for late submissions or assignment re-do's. Please review the course syllabus for your instructor's specific policy.
