### **Cohort**

Cohort classes, lasting 12 or 16 weeks, align with standard school calendars (except for a six-week driver education course available multiple times throughout the year). Participants progress together through course content. The courses are entirely asynchronous (students can take their courses at any time of the day and from anywhere they have internet access) and facilitate teacher and peer interaction.

Cost: \$75 Grade Level: 6-12

### **Flex**

Flex classes, tailored to individual needs, allow students to progress at their own pace on a flexible schedule. Through self-paced learning, students can opt out of specific content by passing a unit pre-test. Even if they test out, completing the full unit post-test and other assessments is required. These fully online courses offer more scheduling and pacing flexibility than cohort courses.

Cost: \$75 Grade Level: 6-12

# **Credit Recovery**

Credit Recovery courses last about 9 weeks and combine an engaging interactive curriculum and supportive IDLA teachers with highly engaged local school personnel. These courses provide the essential asynchronous content needed to provide students with a high level of learning. IDLA provides the NCAA-approved course content that is aligned with Idaho state content standards. Districts provide local personnel to support students with intervention support, social-emotional support, physical and/or virtual technical access to courses, and transcription of credits.

Cost: \$75 Grade Level: 6-12


# Launchpad

Launchpad, designed for K-5 students, enhances English language arts skills by offering interventions for targeted support and extensions for challenging instruction. It's customizable for 6-16 weeks, with five hours/week of live instruction from certified Idaho teachers. Real-time sessions include large-group, small-group, and rotation instruction, adapting to individual needs using Istation data. Progress is monitored biweekly, and instructional groups are adjusted accordingly. Launchpad supports schools and districts in addressing student gaps, fostering success, and achieving significant learning gains. Launchpad is offered in custom sessions only.

Cost: \$30 Grade Level: K-5

## **Advanced Opportunities**

IDLA helps students prepare for life after high school, whether that involves college or starting a career. Our options for middle and high school students include unique electives, advanced placement (AP), Dual Credit (DC), and IDLA Program Pathways. IDLA Program Pathways leads students to industry certificates or a full associate's degree program at an Idaho college or university. Dual Credit courses and Advanced Placement courses are both approved by participating community colleges, colleges, and universities, and these opportunities allow students to earn high school credits and undergraduate credits simultaneously.
